From the moment the call came in, our officers responded with the utmost urgency and care. Due to the seriousness of this incident, and in accordance with established procedures, the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) has taken over the investigation. They will handle all further inquiries and will release updates as they determine appropriate.

During moments like this, we are reminded of how connected we truly are. Aragon is more than a city we are a family. When one of us hurts, we all hurt. We ask our residents to keep the affected families wrapped in your prayers, your thoughts, and your compassion as they navigate an unimaginable loss.

Out of respect for those grieving and to maintain the integrity of the investigation, the Aragon Police Department will not be releasing additional details at this time. We humbly ask for patience, kindness, and understanding as the investigation continues.

In difficult times, the strength of Aragon does not come from buildings or boundaries it comes from the love, unity, and unwavering support we show one another. Let us continue to be a source of comfort, grace, and strength for those who need it most right now.
